## The Junior League of Stark County hosts its 69th Annual Women of the Year Luncheon

The Junior League of Stark County, Ohio, Inc. will recognize two outstanding community volunteers - Natalie Weinsz and Renee Skinner - at its 69th annual Women of the Year Awards luncheon, Thursday, May 12 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Glenmoor Country Club, located at 4191 Glenmoor Road NW in Canton. Keynote speaker will be popular media personality Robin Swoboda. Natalie Weinsz, nominated by Habitat for Humanity, is the 2015 recipient of the Community Award for outstanding service across a broad spectrum of volunteer organizations. Her community involvement includes leadership roles with Habitat for Humanity, the Stark Community Foundation's Women Fund, Christ Presbyterian Church, Congress Lake Women's Golf Association, Green Middle School and High School parent organizations, Central Catholic High School bookstore, Summit County Art Expo, Canton Country Day School, The Junior League of Stark County, YWCA, New Horizons Investment Club, Kappa Alpha Theta House Corporation, and Sitter Service Co-Operative.

Renee Skinner, nominated by Fairless High School, is the 2015 recipient of the President's Award for outstanding volunteerism in a concentrated area - in this case, education. Her volunteer career has included service on the Fairless Alumni Association Board, and she is a founding member of Fairless Helping Fairless. Through her efforts, thousands of dollars have been raised, and hundreds of hours given back to the community annually. The Back to School event at Fairless Elementary School - in which she also involves area businesses, clergy, and individuals - provides backpacks filled with school supplies to any student free of charge. The event includes free back-to-school haircuts, new shoes, clothing, food, and family fun.

Popular motivational speaker, Robin Swoboda will be the keynote speaker. Robin has served as a television news anchor, talk show host, and actress, best known for her career on all three network -affiliated television stations in Cleveland, as well as hosting national television programs. In addition, she has served as a radio personality on 95.5 FM "The Fish" and currently writes a bi-weekly humorous column for the Akron Beacon Journal.

#### **Community Impact**

What a fun 1st year it has been! The 2015-2016 Community Impact Committee has had the privilege of planning, researching and implementing projects that contribute to our three year partnership with The Martin Center.

Active members, Provisionals and Sustainers have continued to provide and serve meals twice a month to the youth at TMC. Our hope and vision is that with the development of a high capacity kitchen, JLSC will be able to provide TMC with the ability to prepare meals on site and sustain their meal service. Proposals are being submitted for grant funding to assist with the kitchen and programming such as "Kids in the Kitchen". JLSC was able to purchase backpacks and thanks to great sustainer assistance, fill these backpacks and send them home with kids from TMC. In addition, in May we will once again be planting the community garden at TMC. We hope to have a wonderful turnout. Please watch for a sign up soon.

The Community Impact Committee toured Andre's House and met with Cliffie McDaniel-Thompson and immediately fell in love - both with Cliffie and her mission. Andre's House is an adult residential facility that provides non-medical

care for persons aged 18-59 who are unable to be cared for at home and have a physical, developmental or mental handicap. We had a fantastic DIAD on Saturday January 23, 2016 planned and organized by Sara Ehret. With over 25 volunteers, we painted the main living area and changed the stark white walls to beautiful happy blue. The room was completed the following week with curtains, wall art, an entertainment center and flat screen TV. Thank you to all who supported Andre's House...our efforts were greatly appreciated.

In February, Stephanie Hand-Cannane implemented a fabulous spa night at The Pregnancy Support Center. GlenOak high school cosmetology students provided manicures, make up application, and fresh hairstyles. Moms were also treated to chair massages, sugar scrubs and swag bags. This event was greatly appreciated by the moms as well as the staff at PSC. The director of the PSC stated that this is



an event that they have been envisioning for many years. The Community Impact Committee was proud to partner with PSC and assist them with achieving their dream.

Thank you to each one of you for supporting our projects and making 2015-2016 a fun year. Our committee is excited to forge ahead with further projects and events at TMC in the next two years, including researching and developing a literacy program, implementing the high capacity kitchen, and creating events that allow us to become more involved with the youth attending TMC.





#### Winter Leadership Recap

The AJLI Winter Leadership Conference was held in Austin, Texas in January 2016. Deanna Parks and Stephanie Helline were both able to attend the conference to learn skills and best practices from other Leagues. 353 delegates from 198 Leagues were in attendance. It was a great experience to talk with other Leagues - both large and small - to exchange ideas. Most of the training we attended, was geared towards Leagues of similar size. We also heard from a panel of similarly sized Leagues in the Small Leagues Big Impact (SLBI) breakout session.

The weekend went quick, but we were able to attend various training sessions including Servant Leadership - Mission Driven, Member Focused, Strengthening Your League's Sustainability which encompasses both Financial sustainability and Programmatic sustainability, Engaging and Inspiring Members, and Building & Nurturing a Collaborative Culture & Shared Leadership. We also learned more about the wealth of information on the AJLI.org website including toolkits, webinars, widgets that can be added to our website, etc. We plan to introduce some of these resources to our members throughout the coming year.



We look forward to incorporating some of what was earned at the conference through board training, at Leadership days this summer, and continue to build in learning opportunities at GMMs throughout the year, as we have been doing.
