It's a new year, and we have a slightly new approach to our Major Project at the Boys and Girls Club of Massillon, trying to reach out to more middle school students. With five more events planned through May, we are looking forward to talking with students about their post high school plans and help them set goals, whether they are looking for a job right out of school or planning to go to college. The Major Project Committee has been working hard to develop plans and activities. Our target age group is 7th through 12th graders. To encourage attendance, if students attend at least four of our events they will be entered in a chance to win an iPad mini at our May Major Project night. We will also have monthly prize drawings for gift cards.

Based on survey results from past events, most of the students that have attended are already thinking about colleges. A few have already taken the ACT exam, but some have asked for more information about how to get into a good school or advice about financial aid. Some of the careers they are interested in include: Accounting, Biology, Cosmetology, Dance, Education, Food Service, Nursing / Medicine, Police / Fire / EMT, Retail, Sports, and Veterinary school. They have a variety of interests, so we try to keep that in mind when planning events. They are looking to hear more from people in "professional careers". We would encourage JL members to attend one of our upcoming events to talk about your career, and any advice you have to share.

We know that not everyone plans to go to college after high school, and it may not be affordable for everyone. So, we hope to show various options for students and get a chance to work with each of them to talk about their goals and dreams, and to help them get there. In January, we have an interactive game planned for middle school students, and we are planning to give a brief overview of resumes and job applications for high school students.

Future events include goal setting and a budgeting activity on Monday, February 17th. We also plan to have military personnel and service jobs (police, fire, etc.) to attend to talk with the students that day. On Tuesday, March 18th we will review interviewing skills and plan mock interviews with students and league members.

Hoover Historical Center





DUES NOTICE

It's that time of year again! Our 2014-2105 membership dues statements are on their way. Dues are \$168 per Active member and \$88 per Sustaining member and Active Non-Residents. Members who are currently on a Leave of absence or are planning to request a leave of absence for the 2014-2015 league year are still required to pay dues. Did you know? Only \$43 per member is paid to AJLI; the remainder of your membership dues is used to support our League's programming and operating income.

Payments are due on or before April 15th and can be made by check, cash, money order, or credit card. Members can mail in their payments, pay in person at the March or April GMMs or at headquarters, or call in their credit card payments to headquarters. This year, members have the "no-fuss" option of paying their dues via a secure credit card payment by logging into the member side of our new website (jlstarkcounty.org). As always, payment plans are available and serve as a great option to pay your dues over four installments. Any member requesting a payment plan should contact our Treasurer, CJ Assent, at cjassent@yahoo.com prior to the April 15th payment deadline.

All of our members are important and serve a vital role in supporting the goals of our League. However, should any member wish to resign, they must do so in writing. Non-payment of dues does not tender your resignation, and you will be removed from membership in poor standing. 


