67th Annual Women of the Year Event

A gorgeous open air setting together with beautiful spring weather made this year's Women of the Year Celebration an amazing event! On May 28, 2014, 175 guest enjoyed a delicious lunch and music provided by a trio from the Canton Symphony Orchestra as we paid tribute to this year's honorees at Gervasi Vineyard pavilion.

Each year, The Junior League of Stark County presents two awards to outstanding female volunteers in Stark County. The Community Award recognizes a woman whose volunteer contributions have touched many areas of the Stark County community. The President's Award recognizes a woman whose volunteer contributions have focused on a specific area: education, health and welfare, the arts or with a specific nonprofit affiliation.

Vicky Sterling was honored with the Community Award for over 20 years of volunteer service to the Pro Football Hall of Fame Enshrinement Festival serving in many different roles including General Chairman. This annual event draws more than 700,000 people to Stark County and produces an economic impact of \$32 million for the Canton/Stark County Area. Vicky oversees 26 Canton Regional Chamber of Commerce committees. Her volunteer activities are not limited to the Hall of Fame. She is a graduate of Leadership Canton and serves on their Board of Directors. She is a long time member of the Women's Board of Aultman Hospital where she has served in various positions on the Women's Board including serving as President in the upcoming year. She has offered her leadership skills and her passion and enthusiasm to the J.R. Coleman Center, Trillium Family Solutions, Ladies Auxiliary VFW Post 7490 and the Women in History Luncheon.

Vicky and her husband, Todd, own Pinnacle Press. They have two children and four grandchildren. Vicky's own quote sums up her commitment to her community "I live life to the fullest, I live by the golden rule and I share my passion with our community in all that I do". President's Perspective

Wow! What a whirlwind year! I hope you are as proud as I am about what we have accomplished in this, our 77th year. Through our efforts to provide more frequent hands-on activities for our members, we were able to provide the services of trained volunteers to more than a dozen agencies and organizations. Considering our traditional projects, we saw 80% of Active and Provisional members give more than 310 hours of service for the Major Project at the Boys and Girls Club, the Provisional Project at the Alliance for Children and Families, and two Done In A Days which benefitted local schools. In addition, the outstanding work of the Fund Development/Major Fundraiser Committee, along with the generosity of our supporters, resulted in revenues far surpassing our goals.

Following the January Cottage Meetings and the associated small group discussions, the Strategic Planning Committee and the Executive Board were able to ascertain that in order to accommodate a changing membership dynamic, to make a larger impact in the community, and to increase member satisfaction, we need to adapt. As a result, the 2014-2015 league year has been informally designated as a planning year. Simply, the Major Project Committee will plan 4 smaller scale projects while Strategic Planning considers the logistics of a large scale, perhaps multi-year, project to begin in 2015.

Furthermore, we will take a hard look at the current leadership structure and consider modifications to management and governance that would allow us to become less top-heavy and more efficient.

It should be evident that we have our work cut out for us in the coming year. As such, I would encourage you to take a bit of time to appreciate all we were able to accomplish this year, and then turn your attention to the future. Ask yourself what YOU can do to advance The Junior League's mission of promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving communities through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. The membership of The Junior League of Stark County consists of smart, vibrant women whose collective skillset is beyond measure, and in order to make JLSC the best it can be, we need you.



Annual Conference

The 92nd annual conference and business meeting of the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) was held May 15-17 in St. Louis, MO, featuring keynote speaker Rebecca D. Costa, author of "The Watchmen's Rattle". At this conference, nearly 700 women, representing 220+ Leagues from four countries, participated in sessions on topics such as collaboration, Sustainer engagement, triple-purpose fundraisers, and turning League focus outward. Technology and Marketing Director Laurie Dodge shared information about new functionalities coming soon to the members' side of the AJLI website (ajli.org) that would allow members from across the Association to better connect

Major Project Update

This year the Major Project was to partner with the Boys & Girls Club of Massillon to provide opportunities to develop and enhance skills youth need to secure long term sustainable futures. The goal of our project was to expose middle school and high school students to new experiences and opportunities.

League volunteers made an impact by helping to plan lessons, like talking about networking, creating a 30 second elevator pitch, or guiding students in exploring colleges, volunteer opportunities, or future careers. League volunteers also shared their stories about how they chose the career they are in, and offered guidance and tips to students. They talked about their careers, stories about school, and lessons learned along the way. We also brought in various speakers from outside of League to talk about other career opportunities. Some of the speakers included business owners Ernie Lehman of Ernie's Bike Shop, and Kim Wagler of Impulse Training. A military recruiter and a fireman also came to talk about their career path and give students an insight of their day to day tasks.

Students had a chance to learn about resume writing and interview skills, and even took part in mock interviews with league volunteers. They also learned about proper dress codes and what to wear to a job interview. The last session included a "what to wear / what not to wear" fashion show, and a trivia game to review each of the lessons we discussed this year.

One of our challenges this year was maintaining attendance through each of our monthly events. Typical participation was 6-8 kids, with our last event having a participation of 20 students! Over the course of the program, we had the chance to touch the lives of 34 students from grades ranging from 8th through 12th grade.

The Boys & Girls Club plans to continue teaching the *BE GREAT: GRADUATE* program with their high school students and junior staff throughout the summer. They plan to purchase additional curriculum books, and League has provided a cabinet that they can store information for career planning. League has also purchased books to leave with the club to help research colleges, finding financial aid and scholarship support, and an ACT prep book with a CD of sample tests.

The Boys & Girls Club was very appreciative of our efforts and the time our volunteers put in to make this program successful. This was exemplified in the following feedback received from the Boys & Girls Club:
